## 2024 Primary Election Information

A Primary Election is a preliminary (nominating) election to select (when necessary) Democratic, Republican, and nonpartisan candidates who will run in the General Election contests. Some, but not all, candidates in nonpartisan contests may be elected to office in a Primary Election if they receive more than 50% of the votes cast.

In Nevada, State and Federal Primary Elections are "CLOSED." This means only Democratic and Republican voters may vote in partisan contests. Additionally, Democratic and Republican voters may not vote for candidates from another party than their own. However, all registered voters may vote in nonpartisan contests, including voters whose party affiliation is other than Democratic or Republican.

DEMOCRATIC PARTY VOTERS: If the party affiliation in your voter registration is Democratic, you may vote in your precinct's contests which select Democratic candidates AND in all of your precinct's nonpartisan contests.

REPUBLICAN PARTY VOTERS: If the party affiliation in your voter registration is Republican, you may vote in your precinct's contests which select Republican candidates AND in all of your precinct's nonpartisan contests.

ALL OTHER VOTERS: If the party affiliation in your voter registration is not Democratic or Republican, you may only vote in nonpartisan contests for your precinct. Minor party, other party, and independent (no party) candidates for partisan contests only appear in the General Election, not the Primary Election.

Other interesting facts about voting in Nevada's Primary Elections include:

- You will have the option to select "None of These Candidates" in all statewide contests (U.S. Senate in the 2024 Primary Election) if you do not wish to vote for any candidate for the office, per NRS 293.269.
- Nevada law (NRS 293.270) does not permit write-in candidates.

## **Electronic Sample Ballots**

You may receive your sample ballot by e-mail instead of through the regular mail. Per Nevada law, your e-mail address will be kept CONFIDENTIAL and it may not be given to third parties. Sign-up today on the Election Department's website by logging in to Registered Voter Services at:

## Register or Update Your Registration

Voting will be easier and faster the sooner you register to vote or make updates to your existing registration. See the Primary Election registrationrelated dates in this newsletter for details about how voting and registration options may change the later you wait.

Check your voter registration (name, address, political party, etc.) online to ensure it is accurate and up-to-date by logging in to Registered Voter Services at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote. If you need to register to vote or make changes to your existing registration, you may do so online at https://registertovote.nv.gov. Other options for registering to vote and updating your existing registration are available through the Election Department's at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote. You may also use the QR codes below.

# Dates for the 2024 Primary Election June 11 is Election Day May 25-June 7 is Early Voting

May 14, Tue.: Deadline for Standard Registration for the Primary Election The fourth Tuesday before Election Day is the last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration without having to do so on the Secretary of State's website or through the same-day registration process.

May 15-28, Wed.-Tue.: Online Only Extended Registration and Updates (14 Days) During this time period, you may register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY online on the Nevada Secretary of State's website at https://registertovote.nv.gov. You will still automatically be sent a mail ballot. You may also opt to vote in-person (instead of by mail) on a voting machine at any Early Voting site or Election Day Vote Center within the County.

May 23, Thu.: No Mailing of Sample Ballots to New or Updated Voters If you register to vote or update your existing registration on or after this date (less than 20 days before the Primary Election), you will not receive a sample ballot for the Primary Election.

#### May 25-June 7, Sat.-Fri.: Primary Election Early Voting, (14 Days)

Any voter registered in Clark County (including those who received a mail ballot and instead wish to vote in-person on a voting machine) may vote at any Early Voting site within the County. In-person same-day voter registration and updates of existing registration will be available. All Early Voting sites also serve as mail ballot drop-off locations. Dates and hours vary by locations.

### May 29-June 11, Wed.-Tue.: Online Same-Day Registration and Updates (14 Days)

Register to vote or update your existing registration online on the Nevada Secretary of State's website (https://registertovote.nv.gov) through Election Day. You will NOT be mailed a sample ballot for the Primary Election for the new or updated registration and you may NOT vote by mail. You may only vote in person on a voting machine at any Early Voting site or Election Day Vote Center of your choice within the County. New registrants may only vote a provisional ballot.

#### JUNE 11, 7AM-7PM, TUE.: PRIMARY ELECTION DAY

Any voter registered in Clark County (including those who received a mail ballot and instead wish to vote in-person on a voting machine) may vote at any Election Day Vote Center within the County. In-person same-day voter registration and updates of existing registration will be available. All Election Day Vote Centers also serve as mail ballot drop-off locations from 7am to 7pm.
