#### V. Informational Items

1. Receive a report from Las Vegas Valley Water District regarding the current well levels, status of the Blue Diamond Water System and other related concerns (for discussion only)

Jordan Bunker of LVVWD reported the monthly water levels. The North well is approximately 15 ft below land surface, South well showing the same. Water system is showing 7 ft higher than last year and is stable.

2. Receive a report from Metro regarding activity and statistics dyring the past month and other area policing concerns (for discussion only)

3. Receive a report from BLM regarding current and upcoming projects, updates on the Legacy Bike Trail, information about the Red Rock National Conservation Area, and other updates about Public Lands in the area (for discussion only)

Our BLM representative reported a 3 day closure due to the storm and gave an update on the phases for the Legacy Bike Trail. September 9th is the Friends of Red Rock 5 K. Campgrounds will open 10/1 with reservation services opening on 9/1.

BLM law enforcement Mike Cyriss reported an increase in vehicle burglaries advising to lock doors and not leave valuables in the car. The concerns of campers gathering and having parties in areas off the road not designated were advised to call Metro due to location.

Meggan reported the planning and zoning items from last month are moving forward. Skid Row will be illuminated mid October. Cottonwood is waiting on a draft from the contractor. She also noted that there is excessive gravel on the roads after the storm and public works is doing their best to address it but has had to prioritize some areas before others due to damage.
