1. Receive a report from Las Vegas Valley Water District regarding the current well levels, status of the Blue Diamond Water System and other related concerns (for discussion only)

Jordan Bunker of LVVWD reported the monthly water levels. The North well is approximately 15 ft below land surface, South well showing the same. Water system is showing 7 ft higher than last year and is stable.

2. Receive a report from Metro regarding activity and statistics dyring the past month and other area policing concerns (for discussion only)

Meggan reported the planning and zoning items from last month are moving forward. Skid Row will be illuminated mid October. Cottonwood is waiting on a draft from the contractor.
